

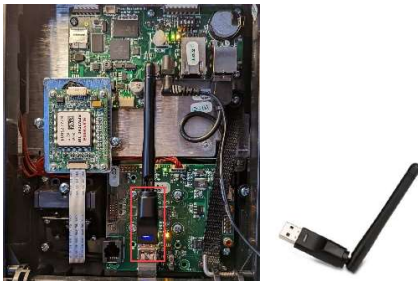
Timeclock Guide – ATS 700 Wi-Fi Adapter Installation Guide

Installing the ATS Wi-Fi Adapter

- 1) Power the timeclock **off**
- 2) **Unlock** the ATS 700 timeclock
- 3) **Insert** the Ralink Wi-Fi adapter with antenna into an available USB port.



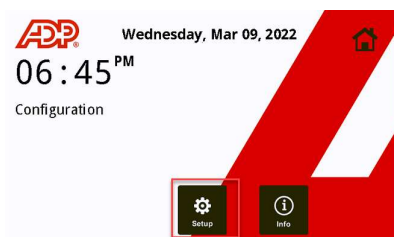
- 4) Power the timeclock back **on**.

Configure the ATS 700 Timeclock for Wi-Fi

- 1) On the timeclock, tap the **Wrench Icon** 
- 2) Enter the Setup Password (Common passwords: 1234 or clock's serial number), Tap **Enter**



- 3) Tap **Setup**



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- 4) Enter Setup Password, tap **Enter Setup**

- 5) **Check** the box next to Wi-Fi, tap **Configure**

- 6) Expand the drop-down box next to **SSID**, tap your Network Name

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- 7) In the **Key** field, enter your Wi-Fi password

- 8) Tap **Save** and wait 15 seconds
